AftEarth

Project Description:

AftEarth is a collaboration between jazz guitarist/composer Ryan Meagher and sketch artist Tina Granzo. The project will be a suite of originally composed music performed by a jazz quartet inspired by and presented alongside drawings that conjure notions of apathy and inaction leading to environmental and social decay. The musicians and artist will depict life, both organic and artificial, as fragile and dependent upon a healthy environment. Granzo's work often reflects open spaces and somber tone (occasionally bordering on sardonic), but it is also quirky and playful. Her monochromatic sketches will be colored by the soundscapes that the musicians paint by deploying similar aesthetics. When landscapes are drawn as empty and arid, the musicians will create a rhythmically sparse wash of sound. Peculiar lines and unusual proportions in the sketches will be represented musically by swirling melodies and a wide range of timbre.
